East Tennessee Foundation

Awards a \$2,500 Unrestricted Grant to Union County Humane Society. UCHS was chosen over all other non-profits in Union County. This is quite an honor an 'ill enable us to replace and explud our outside dog kennels.

Spay/neuter assistance to low income pet owners.

\$1,800 from the sales of Animal friendly license plates was given to UCHS and has made spay/ neuter assistance to low income pet owners possible.

Adopting a pet should be a well thought out decision made only by the persons willing to devote 10 years or more to the love and care of a pet.



Therefore, in most cases we do not encourage the giving of kittens and pu as Christmas presents. It is alvo better to give a card with the message that a wonderful pet is waiting for them at the Union County Humane Society.

\$5,000 Grant from <u>Best Friends Animal Society</u> will help control Union County's feral and free roaming cat population.

This grant will provide free spaying and neutering of feral and free roaming cats for qualifying low income people. Each cat will be spayed or neutered, checked for feline leukemia, given a rabies shot and released back into the roaming cat population. This will result in fewer and a healthier roaming cat population.

"Taylor" served us well for three years - keeping our feet warm by heating the circulating water in the radiant heat floors. The dogs in the indoor kennels loved having "cozy toes" on those really cold nights in the winter.

Taylor sprung a bad leak which would have cost too much to repair. He was replaced the first week of November with a new highly efficient wood burning system thanks to some of our faithful donors who stepped up to begin the fund for the \$11,000 unit. Donations are still needed to finish paying for the new wood burner. Can you help?

Our 5th Annual Motorcycle Ride has grown both in Riders and Revenues for the Shelter.

Bikers in general are very generous people when it comes to raising money for worthy causes. This year 112 people participated. There were 72 mo-







torcycles, 72 riders and 33 passengers, plus 7 more members from the Blood Brothers, a motorcycle club made up of Knoxville police officers who stopped by and made a donation. How fortunate are we to have those guys on our side?

The chilly weather did not deter our riders. The 100 mile ride started at the shelter and ended at Bubba Brews for food music and prizes.

Our efforts were rewarded with over \$6,600 raised all of which will be used to directly support the Shelter.
