



Old Friends in Connecticut

Since 1999, we have routinely shipped dogs to the American Labrador Rescue (ALR) in Connecticut. But not just Labs! Often ALR spots available dogs and puppies on our website and the PetFinder website for whom they're sure they can find homes. Our staff meets the transport truck in north Knoxville on a Friday afternoon. The dogs travel all night and arrive very early the next morning where adopters gather at a designated site to greet and receive their new best friends.

While we ordinarily send only 3–4 animals per shipment, we were excited when ALR recently selected 14 of our dogs (mostly puppies) and transported them to their new adopters in New England. Since we established our relationship with ALR, we have transported hundreds of dogs to new homes in the northeast.
